#### FRONT AIR SHOCK REMOVAL

- 1. SET STEERING TO STRAIGHT AHEAD.
- 2. RAISE VEHICLE.
- REMOVE FRONT WHEEL.
- DISCONNECT THE SWAY BAR LINKAGE. (FIGURE A)

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5. REMOVE THE NUT FROM THE BALL JOINT AND SEPARATE FROM THE SPINDLE ASSEMBLY. (FIGURE B)

6. CLIP/CUT ZIP TIE FROM WIRE HARNESS MOUNT, THEN REMOVETHE WIRE HARNESS MOUNT FROM SHOCK. (FIGURE C)



### **AIR STRUT INSTALLATION**



Tighten all nuts and bolts to manufacturer's specifications during the installation process.



Do not remove the air fitting from the air strut. Doing so may cause damage and/or void warranty. Remove the white shipping pin from the new air fitting and insert the air line until fully seated.

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1. REMOVE THE AIR LINE FITTING. TO DOTHIS REMOVETHE COLLET AND THE REMAINING FITTING WILL SLIDE OFF OF AIR HOSE. (FIGURE G)

- 2. CONTINUE INSTALLATION IN REVERSE ORDER OF AIR STRUT REMOVAL.
- 3. REMOVETHE PLASTIC PIN FROM THE AIR INLET FITTING, PUSHTHE AIR HOSE IN UNTIL IT "LOCKS" IN PLACE (AIR LINE WILL NOT PULL OUT WHEN INSERTED PROPERLY). (FIGURE H)
