This alternator is commonly misdiagnosed as being faulty.

The vehicle this alternator is fitted to has a 'Battery current sensor circuit' installed at the B+ terminal on the battery.

The battery current sensor changes current to voltage (at the positive (+) battery terminal) and sends it to the ECM. The ECM controls the voltage of the alternator based on the signals from the battery current sensor.

The battery current sensor is prone to failure which often leads to misdiagnosed charging faults and the alternator is replaced unnecessarily.

This fault can result in the alternator undercharging and the battery warning light staying on.
